These walks take in four catchments on both sides of the ranges, with a corresponding diversity of forest ecosystems and landscapes including the highest point in the range, Mt. Tassie at 720 metres, which offers dramatic views across the Latrobe Valley and the Great Dividing Range to the North and Wilsons Promontory (the southern most part of the Australian mainland) and Corner Inlet in the south. A 26.4km section links the National Parks, with a rest area half way providing a place to camp. If you were to walk each of the three loops and the Park to Park link, your walk would be 110km long and take 6-7 days at a comfortable pace with time to enjoy the many scenic pleasures along the way.

There are four possible entry points to start your walk; Morwell National Park (Junction Road Carpark), Balook (Tarra Bulga Visitor Centre Carpark), Tarra Valley picnic area Carpark or Macks Creek Hall. The Park to Park walk will take 2 days. The eastern section of the Track can be walked in 3 complete loops of 1-2 days each, starting and finishing in Balook; the Mt. Tassie loop (18.3 km), the Macks Creek loop (25.2 km or 23.7 km depending on choice of route) and the Tarra Valley loop (22.9 km with an optional link to Tarra Valley township, 2.1km each way). Alternatively you could walk these as a continuous circuit of 3-5 days, exploring the walks and attractions of the Balook and Tarra Valley sections of the Park along the way.

An iconic bushwalking experience in the heart of the Strzeleckis



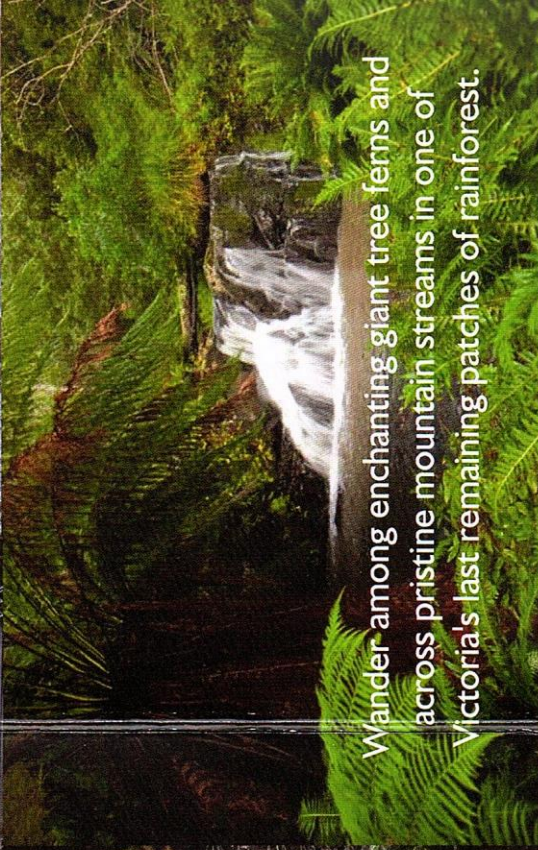
# The Grand Strzelecki Track has something for everyone, whatever your level of experience or fitness.

Overall the Track is Class 4 under the Australian Standard which means that some parts are narrow foot tracks with minimal infrastructure provided, requiring self sufficiency, navigation skills and responsibility for your own safety. Please read the protocols and study the map notes before commencing your walk and plan accordingly.

The Strzelecki Ranges are unique and provide an enormous wealth of biodiversity and scenic values which, until this track was built, were largely inaccessible to the public except for the two beautiful National Parks, Morwell and Tarra Bulga. The Parks charm visitors with pristine rainforest and tall eucalypt forests second to none and a proliferation of plant and animal life such as the South Gippsland Koala,

which is the only genetically intact remnant of the original population remaining in Victoria. The Grand Strzelecki Track links these Parks together and opens up many natural treasures not seen within the Parks including endangered ecosystems, stunning views, waterfalls and much more.

The network of tracks includes existing, rarely used 4WD and forestry tracks, as well as extensive sections of new foot track through mountainous and previously inaccessible terrain. There are three loop walks of 1 to 2 days each, radiating from Tarra Bulga National Park and the tiny township of Balook located at its heart.
